

Web Hit Assignment

Due to MyClasses by 12:30 p.m. Tuesday

For your first assignment, you will select a live event to attend (either on-campus or off; not classes). From that event, you will produce three things:

- 1) A photo
- 2) A social media post (any platform)
- 3) A web hit

Photo:

You must include at least one photo illustrating where you are. It should be clear you are at the event you say you are covering. Use proper photojournalism techniques learning in Journalism I.

Social media post:

Include a screen shot of at least one social media post from a platform of your choosing. The post should contain essential who, what, when and where information in inverted pyramid style. (What is the big takeaway from the event?) ***You may include your photo in your social media post.***

Web hit:

Immediately following the conclusion of the event, you will construct a web hit consisting of all of the following:

- 1) At least 6-8 journalistic grafs (1-2 sentences each)
- 2) At least **two quotes from two different people** (one could be a speaker) with proper attribution
- 3) Inverted pyramid writing (most important to least important, beginning with the main takeaway from the event)
- 4) Numbers (estimate of how many people attended, money raised, etc.)

How this will work:

The point of this exercise is to get you publishing in real-time. Therefore, you will need to submit all three of these elements to MyClasses **within one hour of the event's conclusion**. I will be able to look up the event, so make sure you are keeping yourself honest with this. ***You will be docked 20 points on the assignment if you miss the deadline!*** Remember, you cannot make changes to a MyClasses document without changing the submission time, so keep that in mind. I will consider any late changes as a late submission.

****Important note:**

You must also submit a phone number for each of your sources. If one of your sources is the speaker of an event, you do not need to get his/her phone number. I will check in with these sources at random to ensure you are not using friends/family/co-workers as sources. I will also use them to verify information in your story.
